Year 2

Year Two have been working very hard on their learning in reading, writing and maths this term, and it has been lots of fun too.

In R.E. the children have learned about Christian and Hindu creation stories, including looking after the Earth.

They have been learning about where money comes from, credit, interest and how we can spend it or save it in PSHE.

In Science they have learned that materials can be grouped in different ways according to their properties; materials have useful properties for a given job, e.g., materials can be waterproof, strong, hard, flexible, rigid, light, or heavy. The children have performed tests to find answers to questions that they have, and they found that a boat needs to be waterproof and float.

In Design Technology lessons they had to design a new car for Mrs Armitage. They had to find out whether a floating or fixed axle would make the car go fastest, so they planned and made their cars, and then had a race to find out which axle was better.

For Internet Safety Day, year two children learned about why it is important to be kind when you are online.

Grace Darling was the focus of History lessons, with children learning about how her brave rescue led to the forming of the RNLI.
