### **Reporting Absences**

Are part of the Home/School Partnership Agreement, parents have agreed to phone the academy office if your child is unwell. We are finding an increasing number of parents who are not calling the academy to report an absence. While we do try to make contact with every parent about absent children, it is the responsibility of the parent to let the academy know. We are having an increased number of parents not answering the call and not replying to text messages. It is important that we are informed if your child is not attending so that we know they are safe. For example, if a child in year 6 walks on their own in the morning and they do not arrive at the academy, we do not know where they are. They may still be at home, or they may be somewhere they shouldn't be. So far this week we have had sixteen absences where we have not heard from a parent despite our best efforts. Moving forward please can all parents ensure that they phone the office to speak to the team or leave a message, on the first day of their child's absence, to let us know the reason.
